The Facility

Everything about the Geriatric Transition Center was developed with geriatric and dementia patients in mind. Each individual has their own room, clearly marked with a bright colored door that's easy to recognize and remember. Common areas are comfortable and feel like home.

We also offer a calming sensory room and other daily activities to keep individuals engaged.

Behavioral Aides assist individuals with self-care, around the clock nursing monitors individuals' health, and Clinicians address behavioral health concerns.

We believe individuals excel in settings where they receive wrap-around services and support.

Long-Term Placements


Mount Rogers' Geriatric Transitions Team has already placed more than 80 individuals in community settings.. The team acts as a safety net, working alongside Nursing Homes and Assisted Living Facilities to stabilize individuals, assist with transitions in care, prevent hospitalization, and offer a step-down to decrease individuals' length of stay.

We collaborate daily with surrounding care facilities and community agencies serving the geriatric population (such as DSS, DARs, and Adult Protective Services) to foster relationships that simplify the navigation of the care systems and expand opportunities for placement and resources.

Our Team

The Geriatric Transition Center employs a comprehensive team to care for individuals around the clock. This interdisciplinary team provides both primary and behavioral healthcare:

- Nurse Practitioner
- Registered Nurses
- Clinicians
- Behavioral Aids
- Geriatric Educator



What is the Geriatric Transition Center?

The purpose of Mount Rogers Community Services' Geriatric Transition Center is to reduce psychiatric hospitalizations for the geriatric community.

Our facility feels more like home than a hospital. Individuals staying at the Geriatric Transition Center have their own room. We also offer fun and engaging activities for individuals.

The facility was developed with geriatric and dementia patients in mind. It is easy to navigate, comfortable, and therapeutic.

The Geriatric Transition Center offers 10 beds providing short-term residential care, behavioral support, and transitional planning for individuals with with dementia and other behavioral health needs.While the individual is being stabilized and supported at this facility, the Geriatric Transition Team works with individuals, families, and guardians to find long-term community placement.

Individuals can enter the Geriatric Transition Center as a step-down from a psychiatric hospital, or as diversion when a psychiatric hospitalization is likely.

This facility offers 24-hour care including nursing services.
